Some signs of plant poisoning in dogs & cats:

1. convulsions
2. pale gums or tongue
3. diarrhea
4. swollen tongue
5. abdominal pain
6. refusal of food
7. continual vomiting

If you know which plant was ingested, take a sample with you for correct identification!
